Assignment Expectations

You will choose an Ontario Dance Company or Independent Dance Artist from the following the **"Pulse Youth Dance Conference"** website and than you will create a snazzy **poster** in which you will promote and inform your peers of this **'hot--must see**!!' company or individual.

The **Poster** must include the following information:

- 1. Name of the Company
- 2. Name of the artistic director/choreographer
- 3. The province or city they are based in
- 4. A brief description of their work/style
- 5. A brief summary of the company's philosophy/approach to dance creation/choreography
- 6. Quotations on "what the critics say" about them
- 7. What's up and coming (i.e. what are they currently performing and what is their performance schedule for this season, etc.)
- 8. Pictures of dancers in action in performance.

Contacting Companies

Read the short bios provided on the "**Pulse Website**". Do further research by checking out the artist's websites also provided on the Pulse Website. Try contacting any of these artists by doing an e-interview with them or their general managers. Prepare interview questions ahead of time before emailing them. Introduce who you are and the purpose of your interview. Investigate a few different companies or artists before settling on a decision. Register Company or artist with your teacher.

Poster Design

The poster must be standard poster size--it can be created on Bristol board or you can use adobe PhotoShop/Illustrator or any other graphic design program if you want to design your poster on a computer. If you choose to design using a computer as your tool--you will have to burn it on a CD and take it to a print shop to print it to poster size.
